On October 20-22, 2025 took place in Szombathely (Hungary) the fourth meeting of the RehAllianCE hosted by Pannon Business Network.

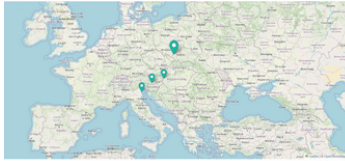
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Pilot actions



Pilot actions - regional living labs

Regional Living Lab pilots will address key rehabilitation challenges by validating selected technologies within local ecosystems. Reports developed with the participation of regional target groups will provide a strong foundation for evaluating and refining joint solutions. These insights will also contribute to recommendations for improving regional healthcare policies, systems, and functional models for organizing effective rehabilitation services using advanced technologies.

Outputs



Smart Rehab strategy

The strategy will be shaped through a comparative analysis of existing models across partner regions, benchmarked against leading international agencies for advanced rehabilitation solutions. It will also provide policy recommendations aimed at enhancing regional and national frameworks, alongside the development of the Smart Rehab 4.0 tool. Regional authorities and target groups will play an active role in shaping the strategy, ensuring a quadruple helix approach and delivering high-quality, practical results aligned with stakeholders' needs.

Rehabilitation is care that helps people get back or improve abilities necessary for their daily life. The challenge is that such care often lies with the family without much systemic or technological support. The RehAllianCE project helps MedTech companies break through and accelerate the commercialisation of their products.
